THE IMPACT OF THE CCC



PRÍNCIPE FOUNDATION

Dedicated to the conservation and protection of the biodiversity of Príncipe Island, the Príncipe Foundation is a local NGO based in Príncipe with a focus on community engagement for conservation.

The Príncipe Foundation began as HBD's environmental and social arm and although it became a fully independent entity in 2016, our strong collaboration continues.

The expenses covered by the CCC donation consists of costs not directly linked to any one project. These funds are crucial to the functioning of the organization as a whole and therefore contribute indirectly to Príncipe Foundation's projects.

Considering the abovementioned, the CCC has supported various projects, such as those focused on the protection of sea turtles, the ongoing development of marine protected areas, the *in situ* conservation of endangered trees, and more.

EDUCATIONAL

Education is fundamental and foundational. The CCC has contributed to reducing the lack of educational resources in Príncipe.

It has helped improve learning, boosting educational play activities, and providing better conditions for schools' kitchens and cafeterias.

Provide opportunities and financial relief for families who could not afford to pay for tickets associated with post-high school education and courses, such as university.



SOCIAL & ENVIRONMENTAL

Allows for the creativity and environmental & social consciousness of Príncipeans to transform into action.

DETAILS ABOUT PRÍNCIPE FOUNDATION

The expenses covered through the CCC donation consist of costs not directly linked to any one project. These are, nevertheless, crucial for the functioning of the organization as a whole and therefore indirectly contributed towards [Príncipe Foundation](#)'s projects. Considering the abovementioned, the CCC supported:

PROTETUGA

This project aims to safeguard all five sea turtles species in the waters and beaches of Príncipe by engaging local communities in conservation, raising awareness on the many threats facing these species, and promoting innovative approaches that reduce these threats. The project seeks to address illegal poaching, marine pollution, illegal extraction and invasive predators through land- and sea-based monitoring of nesting activity, research partnerships with international institutions, and environmental education. Additionally, and as means of promoting more sustainable practices, the project supports alternative income initiatives that contribute towards a reduction in the marine pollution threatening marine turtles.

During the months of July and December 2023, around 27 ProTetuga team members were trained to support the turtle nesting season. Thirteen nesting beaches around the island were monitored. During this period, 529 nests were counted and 756 turtle hatchlings released. In terms of monitoring at sea, 36 beaches were checked daily by the marine team to control hunting on the high seas. The 7th community competition was launched in 12 communities on the island to involve communities in the protection of sea turtles. Collections were made on 11 beaches and in the sea, and the impact on sea turtles was understood. 26 people took part in the workshop to publicise and learn about the methodology for collecting microplastics. 5 young people from fishing communities were involved in the recording of plastics on the beaches (twice a month).

Around 14 fishermen from the communities of Abade, Hospital Velho, Praia Burra, and Ribeira Izé were given fishing materials such as 63 rolls of fishing line, 21 boxes of hooks, 2 rolls of fishing line, and 160 metres of nets as compensation for the damage caused by sea turtles to the fishermen's fishing gear. In terms of environmental education, a drawing competition was organised in 9 primary schools to find out how children perceive the importance of protecting biodiversity.

OMALI VIDA NÓN

Aiming to mitigate threats to marine biodiversity and protect species and habitats around São Tomé and Príncipe, the project is facilitating the participatory designation and management of Marine Protected Areas by community members, local government, and other stakeholders. This approach has been developed through consultations with fishing communities on the two islands, supported by a suite of biological and socio-economic research.



DETAILS ABOUT PRÍNCIPE FOUNDATION *(continued)*

Additionally, the project is engaging coastal communities to increase and diversify incomes through the provision of support and training for the development of sustainable micro-businesses, which directly contribute to the National Poverty Reduction Strategy, the National Sustainable Development Plan, and the objectives of the Príncipe Biosphere Reserve.

In the socio-economic context, socio-economic surveys were carried out in 15 fishing communities with 448 questionnaire samples to assess the impact of the project on them, comparing the activities of the fishing communities in relation to the conservation of marine biodiversity in the period 2019 and 2021. The 14 business initiatives in 12 communities have been implemented since September and will be monitored until March 2024. Training was given in pork handling, particularly to butchers in the community of Hospital Velho. Training on poultry production was given to poultry beneficiaries in São Joaquim.

With regard to research and monitoring, work continued on collecting fishing data from extension workers (fishmongers and/or fish traders) on their beaches. The second phase of underwater mini-monitoring was carried out using "BRUV" traps in the areas of greatest abundance of each species and their diversity, with a sampling design adjusted to the delimitations of the marine protected areas.

Training on monitoring and special communication (SMART) was given to government bodies such as the Regional Fisheries Department, the Regional Directorate for the Environment, the Port Authority, the Coastguard, and members of the Fundação Príncipe team, using technology to monitor and inform decision-making in conservation of terrestrial and marine protected areas.

"STEMMING THE TIDE OF PLASTIC POLLUTION ON PRÍNCIPE ISLAND"

Through the establishment of partnerships with international researchers, the project aims to better understand the issue of marine plastic pollution on the island of Príncipe and design a strategy and regional framework to support turtle and marine conservation actions that can subsequently be replicated nationally and internationally. The project intends to promote the local development of plastic waste-based income alternative initiatives that simultaneously contribute towards a reduction in pollution and the socioeconomic development of local communities, with a focus on women. This approach is aided by an ongoing awareness raising campaign on single-use plastic in local communities and schools.

More details on this project have been shared in the Whitley Fund for Nature report. This project's main results are a recent published article on the plastic pollution on the island, the development of a Regional Strategy against plastic which was shared with the Regional Legislation, and the implementation of 5 business ideas focused on plastic transformation.

DETAILS ABOUT PRÍNCIPE FOUNDATION (*continued*)

Following this work about plastic pollution, FP secured funding from [Darwin Initiative](#). The project aims to build community capacity to monitor the growing scourge of marine plastic on Príncipe Island, and introduce alternative revenue opportunities to tackle existing plastic waste on the island; the project will seek to allay the negative socio-economic impacts on the island's small-scale fisheries, safeguarding food security and helping women and young mothers explore diversified incomes, as well as contributing to Fundação Príncipe's long-standing work with sea turtle conservation through the inclusion of a contra-plastic strategy into its work.

IN SITU CONSERVATION OF THREATENED TREES

This project aims at increasing the *in situ* conservation efforts of 3 threatened and endemic tree species in São Tomé and Príncipe, namely *Carapa gogo*, *Strephonema sp.*, and *Chytranthus mannii*, by protecting their natural habitats, addressing species-specific threats, supporting natural regeneration, and boosting populations through planting, if needed. This project aims also at raising the conservation profile of these threatened trees and catalysing other stakeholders to engage in their conservation.

The team from Príncipe Foundation's terrestrial flora department held a workshop on environmental laws in São Tomé and Príncipe in July 2023, with the participation of various technicians from the environmental sector, organised civil society, and community representatives, in order to inform different stakeholders about the existence of laws and their importance for biodiversity conservation.

Strephonema sp. and *Chytranthus mannii* were monitored with the introduction of 2 more *Carapa gogo* plots for monitoring. At Praia Seca, 60 *Strephonema sp.* seedlings were monitored and are ready to be transplanted into their natural habitat.

FAO'S "THE RESTORATION INITIATIVE" (TRI)

The aim is to integrate the communities into the conservation actions and restore the HBD concession areas, promoting a green Príncipe. Around 13 communities are involved, with 100 families engaged in the project.

The project contracted 56 seedling producers, who received training on handling and management of plant nurseries, to produce the seedlings of endemic and protected species.

26,000 seedlings were produced by the group (members of involved communities) and delivered to HBD to be replanted on their concessions.



DETAILS ABOUT PRÍNCIPE FOUNDATION (*continued*)

LIQUEZA TÉLA NÓN

The project intends to safeguard the globally relevant biodiversity and ecosystem services of Príncipe Island through the strengthening of capacity and national frameworks for biodiversity and natural resource management, integrated territorial planning, enforcement of the environmental legal framework and improved management of protected areas.

The implementation of its various components is the responsibility of several government directorates, the Regional Government of Príncipe and a consortium of NGOs led by Birdlife International, within which Fundação Príncipe is an implementing partner. Main project activities led by Fundação Príncipe include: updating the Príncipe Natural Park's (PNP) Management Plan; identifying High Conservation Value areas and formalizing innovative mechanisms that ensure their sustainable management; implementing biodiversity and threat monitoring protocols; building local capacity and providing technical support towards the effective management of the PNP; and engaging local stakeholders in the development and implementation of strategies for community led conservation management.

This project focused on monitoring, such as carrying out the International Waterbird Census between January and February; monitoring the Tinhasas Islands seabird colony as part of the International Waterbird Census in December; and studying the ecology of Príncipe's endemic amphibians in partnership with the Faculty of Sciences of the University of Lisbon as part of the master's degree project "Passive acoustic monitoring for the conservation of Príncipe Island's amphibian community."

PLANS FOR THE REMAINING FUNDS

Before describing the plans for the remaining funds for 2023, we would like to provide additional information about the remaining funds from the previous year (1 October 2021 – 31 December 2022), which had a total value of €61,918.37.

Last year, a vote among the HBD team concluded that the remaining funds should support community libraries. Significant work was carried out to turn this into a reality.

However, during the course of this work, we learned that in Príncipe there are already several reading centers and many books, both in schools and in these reading centers. We concluded that the primary need is, in fact, to encourage and stimulate children to read. The challenge is not a lack of materials.

In this sense, the plan for the remaining value of the CCC has been changed and the funds will be used differently: in collaboration with the California Academy of Sciences, we developed a science education program, focusing on the endemic species of Príncipe, for third graders and high school students on the island. This educational program will include the creation and printing of a children's book (which is also a coloring book), about the island's endemic species, for third graders across the island and education about and a field guide to the endemic birds for high school students.

This educational program will also include interactive community events, such as educational theater, and the creation of a small group of young women who will meet monthly to learn about and be inspired to enter scientific and natural fields after high school. This collaboration with the California Academy of Sciences has already begun and the fieldwork in Príncipe is scheduled for September - October 2024.

A total of €26,662.79 represents the remaining value of the 2023 CCC. It is important to note that this is only currently stated as remaining because it is earmarked for requests approved during the past year, but for which funds are still in the process of being distributed (for example, delays in transportation to Príncipe Island). Additionally, these funds are being used to fulfill approved requests from between January and March 2024 and that distribution will be detailed in the 2024 CCC report.
